As we were preparing to usher-in the final two months of the year, the mandir hosted the Sri Satyanarayan Puja and Kirtan on Sunday, the 2nd of November. Within the month of November, this was followed on the 9th, by the Sundarkand Recitation Sri Ramcharitamanas of Goswami Tulsidas by Swasti Pandya and Devotees. The Maha Mrityunjaya Japa and Homa was observed on Sunday, the 16th, with many devotees and their families in attendance. Sunday the 23rd observed the conductance of the Sri Ramanama Sankirtana and Meditation. Thanksgiving Celebration was held on Thursday, the 27th of November. The event began at 3 PM, with a Hindustani music concert by the renowned vocalist, Smt. Shubhangi Sakhalkar. She was accompanied on the tabla by Sri Sripad Torvi, and on the harmonium by Sri Vivek Datar. With a harmonious start to the evening, the swelling audience grew to a

The concert was followed by a very traditional international vegetarian dinner, hosted by the families of some of our long-time devotees! The dinner was observed as “prasad” by all those who partook.

Sunday, November 30th served as the observance of Srimad Bhagavad Gita Jayanti. The event started-off at 10:30 AM with a Kiran by the Stanford Bhajan Ensemble. The Kirtan drew good applause from the audience present! This was followed by a Talk on the Bhagavad Gita by Dr. Rajeev Verma. Dr. Verma has been studying the Gita since 1993, and has been teaching a Gita Paath since 2009.

On this day, Dr. Verma expounded the teachings from select section of the Bhagavad Gita. As part of the discourse, Dr. Verma answered questions from the audience, which were very contemporary and topical in nature, given the current observance of cultural tensions caused by mass migration into Western Democracies, of populations/people that have demonstrated little or no evidence of interest to integrate into their new host nation’s societies.

After an eventful November, the month of December was even more celebratory! On Sunday, the 7th of December, Badarikashrama held the Samuhika 108 Sri Satyanarayana Swami Puja and Katha. This Puja was formulated by our ancient saints for families and individuals to strengthen their faith and devotion, and to collectively pray for the health, happiness, peace, as well as for spiritual and material prosperity. This special puja is held at Badarikashrama twice a year, in the months of May and December. This year’s event started off at 10:30 AM with a Kirtan recital by the students of Rita Sahai. The troupe performed a few melodious pieces, to set the spiritual mood with the audience and devotees.

This was followed by the puja itself led by Swamiji and supported by Vishnuji. The many families present sat for worship, with the Kalasha provided by the mandir. Upon completion of the Aarti, the devotees partook of the mahaprasad, in the form of lunch, sponsored by some of the families.

Sunday the 14th of December, hosted the Sri Sarada Devi Jayanti. As an event following the Sri Rama-krishan order, Badarikashrama conducts this event with its traditional honor.
