The month of September opened with Sri Satyanarayana Puja and Kirtan on the 7th. The event marked the onset of the Mahalaya Pitrupaksha Amavasya period from September 8th to the 21st. Sunday the 14th saw the recitation of the Sundarkand Sri Ramacharitamanas authored by Sri Goswami Tulasidas. Sunday the 21st was the final day of the Mahalaya Pitrupaksha Amavasya period. The day hosted the Sri Ramanama Sankirtana & Meditation. Several devotees and their families attended the event, and offered obeisance and prayers for the peace of souls of their elders. For over 30 years, Badarikashrama has been hosting ceremonies like these, playing a yeoman role in upholding and continuing the deeply spiritual practices of Sanatana Dharma.

Navaratri Celebrations commenced on September 22nd. Also celebrated as Sri Durga Puja, this stretched a period from the 22nd of September, to the 2nd of October. Considered one of the holiest of festivals of Hinduism (Sanatana Dharma), this is a nine-night Hindu festival honoring the divine feminine, primarily the goddess Durga, and celebrating the victory of good over evil. Daily schedule incudes a "Sri Chandi Paath" form 5 AM to 7 AM; Sri Durga Homa from 10:30 AM to 12:30 PM; Sri Lalita Sahasranama Recitation, Puja and Aarti from 6:30 PM to 8 PM. Of course, there were special programs, as below! Friday, September 26th featured Mata Ki Chowki by Harjeet Mehendi and Friends, who have always delighted their fans and audiences!

Ashtami was celebrated on the 30th, the eighth day of the Navratri festival, observed in honor of the goddess Durga. It is a significant day of worship, with common rituals including fasting, performing pujas, and observing Kanya Pujan. Devotees offer prayers to Maha Gauri Maa by performing havan rites, and reciting Durga Sapatashati Paath. Badarikashramna marked this day in a special manner, as it has done during prior years, true to its commitment to spirituality and at norms and traditions of Hinduism.

October 2nd marked Vijaya Dashami Celebrations, also known as Dussehra. The day symbolizes the triumph of good over evil. It celebrates Lord Rama's defeat of the demon king Ravana, as told in the epic Ramayana. It also marks Goddess Durga's triumph over the buffalo demon Mahishasura, which concludes the Durga Puja festivities. After the Sri Durga Homa, long-time patron Smt. Illorak Jha and friends performed the Mahishasura Mardini enactment. This was followed by Aarti and Prasad.

October 7th marked Sharad Purnima celebrations. This also happened to be the day we celebrated Swamiji's birthday! The evening bustled with devotees in attendance for Sharad Purnima celebrations, intermingling with those visiting SwamiJi to deliver birthday wishes! October 12th hosted a Srimad Bhagavad Gita talk. This day was special as the featured speaker was Devyani Biswas, a long-time devotee and patron of Badarikashrama. Devyani quoted select verses from the Bhagavad Gita and answered many questions posed by the audience.

The festival of Deepawali was celebrated on October 19th. Deepawali's significance lies in the victory of light over darkness, good over evil, and knowledge over ignorance, symbolized by the lighting of lamps.
